John was a Calvery soldier in the Civil War. 59th Regiment, Alabama Company A, Enlisted November 16, 1863 Montgomery Alabama. He was approximately 43 years old at enlistment. He was captured at Appomattox (Farmville Virginia) 6 days before the end of the war. John lived in Tallapoosa County. He is listed in the 1870 census (page 21 stamped, Written page 32) Hackney Post office Tallapoosa County. His two youngest sons Washington and Henry were born after the war.
